Our Meeting:

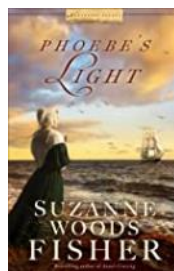
- How does our meeting accommodate ecological, economic and social justice in its uses of property, money?
